Worship in August

Ephesians: One Body in Christ

Our current worship series is a study of Paul's letter to the Ephesians. In this letter, Paul is addressing what it means to be the people of God who are united to Christ and one another as His Church. What does it mean to be the Church? What are the blessings? What is our calling? This is a timely study as we seek to be the people of God in a "post-Church" culture, but also as our own congregation is preparing for a time of transition in leadership. May God bless His Church universal, and our own congregation, as we seek to follow Him!

August 4

"Made Alive in Christ" - Ephesians 2:1-10

God has brought us from death to life. We who were dead in sins have been brought to spiritual life as a gift of grace. This grace is received through faith in Christ, who died and rose again for us. Today we focus on the meaning of grace and what it means for how we think of God, ourselves, and our lives.

August 11

"One People in Christ" - Ephesians 2:11-22

Because of Christ's sacrifice, Jews and Gentiles are now one in Him. But this isn't just about Jews and Gentiles. Redemption in Christ means that all who belong to Him are one. We are one people in Christ.

August 18

"Be the Light" - Matthew 5:13-16

We focus on our school's theme for the new school year: "Be the Light." Jesus tells His followers that they are the light of the world and calls them to let their light shine that others may give glory to God. We are called to reflect and shine the light of Christ in all that we think, say, and do, that God might be glorified in our lives.

August 25

"God's Plan for His Mission" - Ephesians 3:1-13

Paul writes about being part of God's plan to bring the Good News of Jesus to the Gentiles. Paul was the most unlikely instrument of the Gospel, yet God in His wisdom chose him. You and I are not apostles as Paul was, but still, we have a part to play in God's mission.

Mission India Update

We have received the reports from Mission India regarding our ministry partners of this past year. We will be including the Literacy Class update in this week's e-Vine and in worship, and Pastor Mike will report on the Children's Bible Clubs and Church Planting in the coming weeks.



We partnered with Mission India to provide 2 Adult Literacy Projects. That's 10 classes. 300 students were enrolled. Of those, 250 completed the program and graduated. 117 of those came to faith in Christ during the year, and 55 of those were baptized. The classes led to the formation of 16 prayer groups and 6 new worshiping communities. Many reported dramatic lifestyle improvements as well, including healthy living and improved relationships.

We partnered with Mission India to provide 2 Children's Bible Club Projects: That's 10 clubs. 380 students were enrolled. Of those, 142 came to faith in Christ, along with 98 parents. 61 children and 44 parents were baptized. In addition, the clubs led to the formation of 20 prayer groups and 6 worshiping communities. Students also reported doing better in school, having better relations with family, and improving in showing respect to others.

We partnered with Mission India to support 7 church planters. These church planters collectively planted 10 new worshiping congregations and 21 prayer groups. 324 people came to faith in Christ, and of these, 55 were baptized. The Church planters also started children Bible clubs, enrolling 257 children in these clubs, leading to 39 children coming to faith in Christ.

Praise God for His work through this partnership! Over the years we have partnered with Mission India, we have been part of the formation of 136 congregation and 346 prayer groups. The adults who have come to faith number 2551, along with 724 children. To God alone be the glory!

St. John's Lutheran School's planning for the 2024-2025 school year is progressing at a rapid pace.

Our faculty and staff retreat will be August 11 - 13, 2024. The first day of school will be Wednesday, August 21, 2024, with a half day for the elementary students.

We often appeal for additional volunteers at the Farm. That is especially needed now when the harvest is in full swing. We work Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays, from 8:30-11:30 am. We work with our paws (OK, hands), then we break and exercise our jaws, eating and making conversation. It's worthwhile, charitable work, and it's fine fellowship.


Sunday Bible Classes

Meditation:

"12 And she said, "As the LORD your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a jug. And now I am gathering a couple of sticks that I may go in and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it and die." 13 And Elijah said to her, "Do not fear; go and do as you have said. But first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterward make something for yourself and your son. 14 For thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, 'The jar of flour shall not be spent, and the jug of oil shall not be empty, until the day that the LORD sends rain upon the earth." 15 And she went and did as Elijah said. And she and he and her household ate for many days. 16 The jar of flour was not spent, neither did the jug of oil become empty, according to the word of the LORD that he spoke by Elijah." (1 Kings 17:12-16)(ESV)

Faithful in all Things

Jesus said, "Whoever can be trusted with very little can be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much" (Luke 16:10). Jesus is saying that a

faithful person will handle God's gifts faithfully regardless of whether they have few or many gifts entrusted to them. What we do with what we have shows our faithfulness.

A faithful person will do the small things well. One day a young man went to a bank to apply for a job. After his interview, he was leaving the bank and happened to notice some small trash on the floor. He picked it up and put it in the waste paper basket. Seconds later, he helped an elderly lady with the door. Unknown to the young man, the man who had interviewed him for the job was observing him. The young man was promptly summoned back and given the job. The employer's comment: "Anyone who pays attention to the small things as you just did needs to work here."

Unfortunately, we Christians may incorrectly think that small things aren't important to God. We may have the attitude that God won't be concerned with the small amount of money or other gifts that we have been given. In the Bible, God spoke mightily through the little that people had. God used the widow and her two mites to teach us a lesson about sacrificial giving. He used the small amount of flour and oil that the Widow of Zarephath had to demonstrate obedience. Jesus used the loaves and fish of a young boy to reveal how God can magnify a small gift. God commended their faith with small things, and He didn't overlook what faithful people did with small things.

Through God's Word, we understand that small things do count. Because we understand our need to be faithful with all things, we should ask ourselves how we are handling the seemingly small things in our lives. Are we handling small things well in our homes, jobs, and churches? Can non-Christians see a difference in us? With God's help, we can be faithful with **ALL** that we've been given. Through our faithfulness, God will be glorified.

Prayer:

Dear Heavenly Father, certainly, in order to measure up to Your standards, I must ask You to increase my faith. Still I fail, for I do not love You with my whole heart, nor am I faithful in all things. Therefore, I thank You for the gift of Your Son Who has met Your standard of perfection and has lived that standard in my place. Forgive me, Lord, for my failures. Strengthen my faith in You. Teach me to depend on You to give me all that I need. Through Christ I pray. Amen.

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Olympic Games and Paralympic Games Paris 2024



For many of us, summer of 2024 marks the greatly anticipated international sporting events known as the Summer Olympics! The current games are being hosted by the world-class city of Paris, France. The **Summer Olympics** take place from Friday, July 26, to Sunday, August 11, 2024. The **Summer Paralympics** also take place in Paris beginning on Wednesday, August 28, and end on Sunday, September 8, 2024.

About 10,500 athletes from 206 countries will compete in the Summer Olympic Games. There will also be a team of refugee athletes who compete under the Olympic flag. The United States will have 592 athletes in competition. Around 4,400 athletes are expected to participate in the Paralympic Games representing over 150 National Paralympic Committees.

You may wonder: "What are the Paralympic Games? It is the largest international event for athletes with disabilities and for societal change, and takes place shortly after every Olympic Games event in the same host city. The Paralympics has grown from a small gathering of British World War II veterans in 1948 to become one of the largest international sporting events by the early 21st century.

The Olympics always are given great media coverage around the world. In contrast, the Paralympics have most often been given little, if any, media coverage! There are some efforts this year to give greater attention to the achievements of these remarkable athletes. I would challenge you, as caring people, to expand your Olympic coverage this year by watching some of the Paralympic Games. The viewing information will be available after the August 11th closing of the Olympic Games. You will be amazed by the strength, skills, ingenuity, and courage of the athletes who have challenged themselves to shine through their disabilities! Too often, society limits the expectations and futures for people who have disabilities. Be a person who encourages and supports the hopes and dreams of others, especially those who have great challenges in their lives! Broaden your awareness of God's gift in each person!

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Stephen Ministry: The Power of Validation

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Romans 15:13



Below is a story to show how a Stephen Minister can care for someone – by listening in a non-judgmental, patient, accepting manner:

After their previous meeting, Andrew (the care receiver) was feeling more comfortable about meeting with his Stephen Minister, Ben. Andrew had started to dig into his difficult feelings about God and faith, and he was encouraged that Ben had arrived right on time and stayed focused throughout their meeting. Andrew was still uncertain, though, about how openly he should share. Some of what he'd been thinking about his faith got into uncomfortable territory, and he was worried that, if he let it all out, Ben might be shocked and condemn or dispute his thoughts and feelings.

Andrew decided to go ahead and open up – and Ben remained relaxed and understanding. Ben assured him that what he was thinking and feeling was a natural response to what he'd been through; it didn't mean he'd lost his faith. That gave Andrew the confidence to go deeper still until he'd said everything on his mind and heart. It felt good being able to say all that while still feeling accepted.

As their meeting ended, Andrew told Ben, "I can hardly believe I could say those kinds of things out loud without being judged. Thanks so much for listening."

Stephen Ministers are trained to listen well. The definition of validation is the process of learning, understanding, believing, and accepting another person's thoughts and feeling about his or her experience – and letting the other person know you've done so, which communicates that his or her thoughts really do matter. Validation builds trust, strengthens relationships, and lets the other person know it's safe to continue sharing.


