wonder where their bread for the day will come from, what does it mean to pray for it?

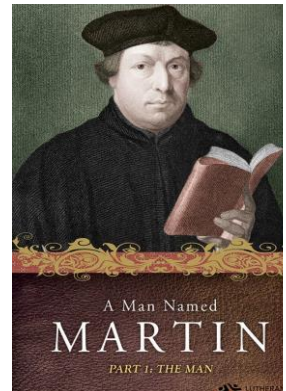

We can see in this prayer a call to thankfulness, and even contentment, acknowledging the Lord as the source and giver of all good gifts.

As the people of St. John's, we were gather on **Thanksgiving Eve, November 27, at 7:00 PM**, to offer God our thanks for our daily bread. One way we can express our thankfulness, is giving as we have received. So all are encouraged to bring along an offering for the Napa Food Bank as well.

Sunday Bible Class

A Man Named Martin

Pastor Mike will be continuing a study of the story and legacy of Martin Luther. The purpose of this class is to examine Luther's life and times through the lens of history, religion and theology. But the point is not just to gain historical knowledge about the man. The story of his life naturally leads into discussion about the authority of Scripture, the nature and meaning of the gospel, and what it means to stand up for your faith in word and deed. We will be meeting in Room 8.





This month we conclude our worship series on Paul’s letter to the Ephesians, devoting two Sundays to important words from Paul regarding living our faith in the workplace, as well as bring armed by Christ for spiritual struggles. We also mark special services in the Church year, observing All Saints Sunday on November 3 and wrapping up the liturgical Church year by celebrating Christ the King Sunday on November 24.

November 3 (All Saints Sunday)

“Blessed Are You” – *Matthew 5:1-12*

We step out of our Ephesians series on All Saints Sunday to focus on the grace by which we are declared and called to be Saints. In the Beatitudes, Matthew 5:1-12, Jesus describes a kingdom radically different from the kingdoms of the world. This is a kingdom of grace and faith. We are brought into the kingdom by grace, even though we are poor in spirit. We live in this kingdom by faith, following Christ above all.

November 10

“Honoring Christ in our Work” – *Ephesians 6:5-9*

Paul’s words about slavery translate into our present culture as instructions on how we think about being employees and employers. What does it mean to work as though working for Christ, and managing others while mindful that Christ is your manager?

November 17

“The Armor of God” – *Ephesians 6:10-24*

We are daily engaged in a spiritual battle with the forces of spiritual evil. But God does not intend for us to go into this fight unarmed and unarmored. Paul describes Christ’s gifts to us in terms of the armor of a Roman soldier. How do I equip and make use of this armor in my daily walk?

November 24

“Not of this World” – *John 18:33-37*

Jesus tells Pilate that His kingdom is “not of this world.” By this He does not mean that His kingdom is not present and active in the world. It most certainly is! But rather it is unlike the kingdoms of the world. How is Christ’s kingdom different and what does that mean for us?

If you are a veteran, we would be honored to have you attend this very special Chapel Service. If you know a veteran, please pass along this invitation.



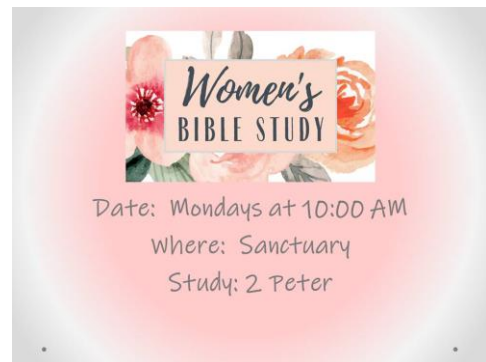

OFFERING UPDATE

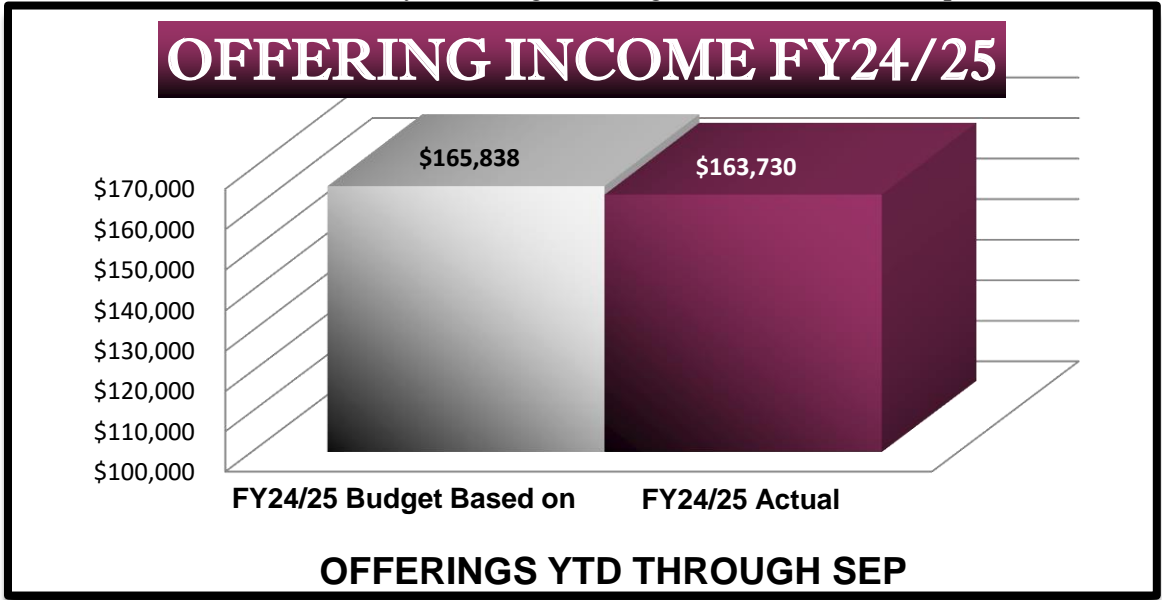
Actual Offering Income for Sep:

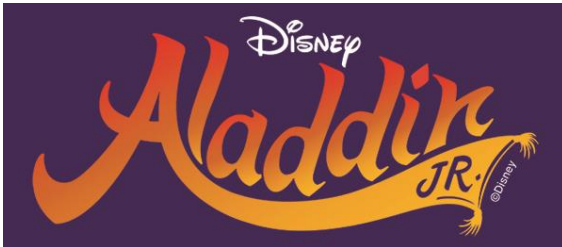

The warm weather crops are all harvested. Normally we would be shifting to the cool weather plants like cabbages and broccoli. Sadly our broccoli and cabbage seedlings did not do well. The saying in Nebraska was, “Farmers don’t go to Vegas to gamble; they just visit their fields.” With the cool weather crops we gambled and lost! So most of the fields are being tucked in snug beds under blankets of cover crop for a long winter’s nap. That will also give our volunteers some rest as well. By the grace of God, we did reasonably well anyway. We will end this year around (drum roll, please) the 20,000 lbs. mark of produce gleaned and taken to the CANV Food Bank for distribution.

Stephen Ministry: Love one another

“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest”
Matthew 11:28

When Do We Need God’s Love Most? Of course, we need that love every second of our lives. But at times God’s love is especially precious to us, such as when:

- we lose a loved one
- life becomes so confusing that we do not know where to turn
- we are dealing with an illness, or caring for a loved one who is ill
- life becomes meaningless, and depression sets in
- going through a divorce or separation
- experiencing a spiritual crisis
- life changes such as birth, adoption, miscarriage, or infertility



At times like these, it is especially important to have someone who cares. Our congregation has Stephen Ministers who offer Christian caring for those in need.

Suffering on our own is not God’s intent for us. God did not create us to be independent. We are created to be *interdependent*. God’s Word is clear: *“It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him”* (Genesis 2:18). The New Testament underscores this theme with more than 50 verses that contain the words “one another” such as *“love one another, encourage one another, build up one another,”* and *“pray for one another.”* God’s love shows through when we allow other people to love, encourage, build up, and pray for us.

Our Stephen Ministers know about receiving care. Many of them have received care themselves at some point in their lives – something that has motivated them to give care now. They know how difficult it is to ask for help, and they also know the great personal and spiritual growth and healing that follow. They know how to respond in a loving, caring, and nonjudgmental manner. They are equipped, ready, and waiting to provide the comfort and care God very much desires you to have.

If you find yourself now or in the future facing difficulties in life, do not suffer alone. Take the courageous step of seeking help. Open your heart to receiving God’s love and grace through another person. Our Stephen Ministry offers the opportunity for a very confidential relationship with someone who will listen to you and provide you with the care and encouragement you need, helping Christ to bring rest to your weary, burdened heart.
