- **Youth Activities** - Provide activities for the young people - games or children's activities

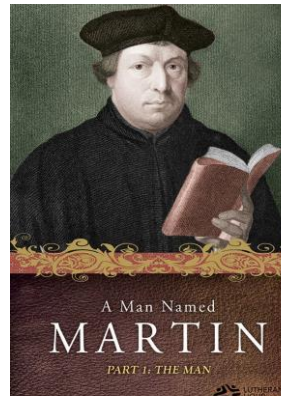

A Man Named Martin

Starting October 6, Pastor Mike's Sunday Bible class (11:00) will focus on the story and legacy of Martin Luther. The story of his life naturally leads into discussion about the authority of Scripture, the nature and meaning of the gospel, and what it means to stand up for your faith in word and deed. Worship in October

Ephesians: One Body in Christ

We continue our worship series on Paul's letter to the Ephesians. In this letter, Paul is addressing what it means to be the people of God who are united to Christ and one another as His church. What does it mean to be the Church? What are the blessings? What is our calling? This is a timely study as we seek to be the people of God in a "Post-Church" culture, but also as our own congregation is preparing for a time of transition in leadership. May God bless His Church universal, and our own congregation as we seek to follow Him!

October 6 "Living With Wisdom" – *Ephesians 5:15-20*

Paul calls the Ephesians to live not as unwise, but as the wise. The key to wise living is to be led by the Holy Spirit, who is at work in us in the Word and in Worship. Wisdom in life flows from the Spirit, so pursuing a life of wisdom begins and ends with placing ourselves where the Spirit has promised to be at work.

October 13 "A Marriage Shaped by the Gospel" – *Ephesians 5:21-33*

Marriage is designed by God to be a living picture of the relationship of Christ and His bride, the Church. Wives submit and husbands lay down their lives in beautiful self-giving that is modeled on the Church's faith and Christ's love.

October 20 "The Training and Instruction of the Lord" – *Ephes. 6:1-4*

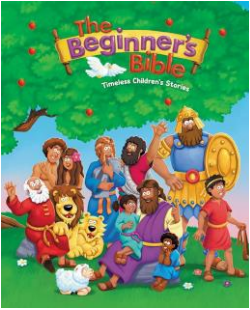
How do we honor the Lord in our parenting? Paul calls on parents to bring up their children in the "training and instruction of the Lord." What does this mean? How do we do that?

October 27 "Justified Freely" – *Romans 3:19-28*

What does it mean to be justified? What is my standing before God? We take a look at the teaching at the heart of the Reformation, that we are justified by grace through faith in Christ.

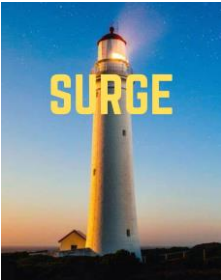
YOUTH MINISTRY



Things are slowing up at the Mission Farm. The warm weather crops are all but harvested except for a few summer squash plants, the tomatoes, and the bell peppers and the jalapeno peppers.

Normally we would be shifting to the cool weather plants like cabbages, broccoli, fall squashes. Sadly our broccoli and cabbage seedlings did not do well, and so we will have to forgo those plants this year. We'll harvest the fall squash a bit later. But we'll probably plant cover crop over most of the fields and give them a good rest this winter. That will also give our volunteers a good rest as well. They need it.

It doesn't mean that there is nothing to be done during the fall and winter. Fruit trees will need to be pruned, dormant sprays applied when and where required, weed control still necessary, sharpening tools, servicing the tractor and rototiller, repairs to some of our buildings, etc., etc., etc. Also there is yet the fund raising, the crop planning for next year, the ordering of seed, and the recruitment of next summer's volunteers.

Speaking of fund raising, we will be participating once again in CanDo's 2024 Give!Guide campaign during November and December. Watch for more details, and begin doing your gift planning. We need your (as well as the community's) financial support. You can always support us through the usual way at church, using your designated offering envelope. CanDo's Gift!Guide also makes it easy. You can give gifts by credit card or by check. Your gift through G!G swells the dollar total that is on their online web site, and suggests that many believe and support the work we are doing. That helps our success in participating in the G!G program. Either way, the church will provide you with evidence of a donation for tax purposes.

Also, if anyone wishes to make a major gift that can be used for matching gifts purpose for the G!G campaign (a popular method of boosting many smaller gifts), or would be open to becoming a business or corporate sponsor, please talk to me soon. Oh, and I almost forgot to add the harvest total as we entered September . . . 16,250 lbs. Yes, that is more than 8 tons (or at least it was when I went to school).

Stephen Ministry – Acceptance



“See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!” 1 John 3:1

“But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.” Romans 5:8

“Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God.” Romans 15:7

God accepts us as we are, with all our faults and humanness. He knows we fall short of perfection and knows how much we need his unconditional love. We can rest in His arms and receive refreshment for our souls, forgiveness for our shortcomings, nourishment to grow, and energy to face another day.

Acceptance by God, by our family, our friends, coworkers, even acquaintances can make us feel respected and understood. It is a great gift to give to each other. Stephen Ministers provide acceptance when they meet with a person receiving their care. The Stephen Minister will listen with empathy, reflect with care and respect, and accept what the person is feeling. The distinctively Christian nature of care creates an atmosphere of acceptance and encouragement so the care receiver can feel comfortable sharing about what’s going on, including what he or she is dealing with spiritually. Stephen Ministers know that God is always present in the caring relationship and that the Holy Spirit is working through them to bring healing to the care receiver.

Perhaps you’ve heard the saying: *God loves you just as you are but too much to leave you that way* (attributed to several authors). A Stephen Ministers accepts the person who is receiving care and helps that person along the path to healing and greater wholeness. The changes are up to God and the care receiver, with the Stephen Minister supporting, validating, and accepting the care receiver.

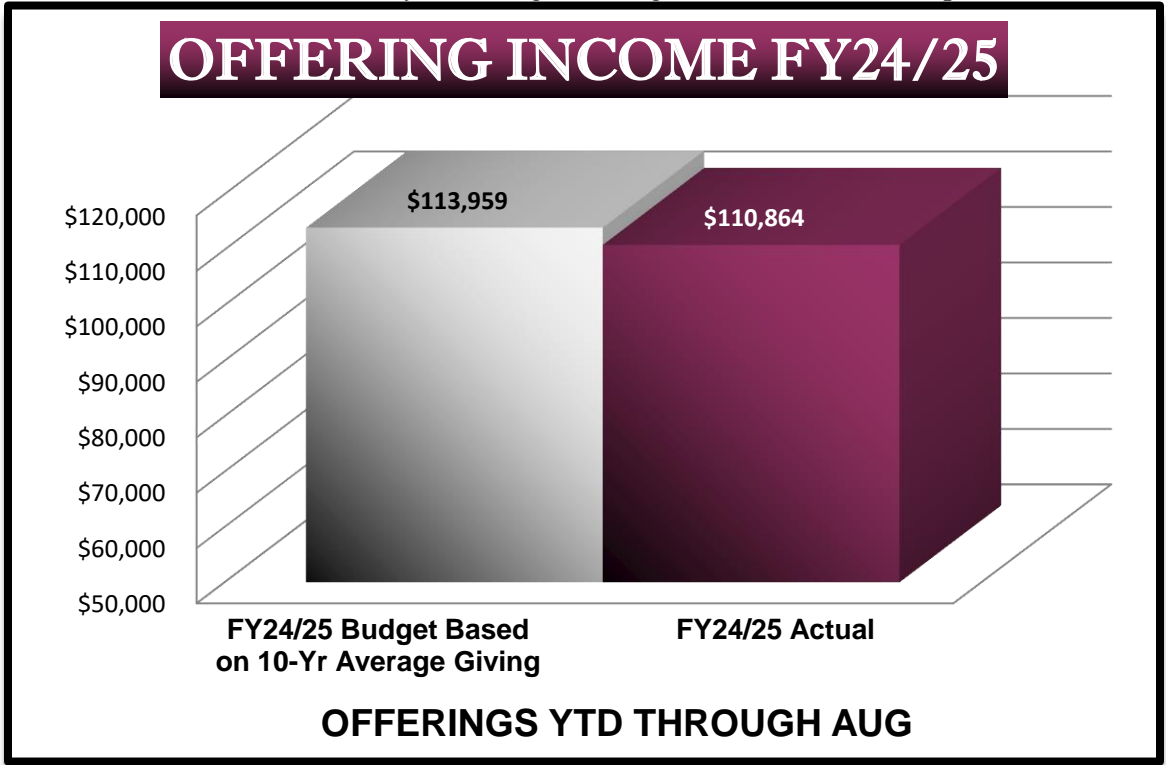
Actual Offering Income for Aug:

“It shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many.”
(Matthew 20:26-28)(ESV)

The Exalted State of Servanthood

Martin Luther, the author of the Reformation which we celebrate the end of October, wrote, “A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of

all, subject to all.” Perhaps those two sentences appear at first to be contradictory. What Luther was trying to help us understand is that we, as Christians, are called to freedom from an obligation to serve, but that we are called to the freedom to serve joyfully.

This call to joyful servanthood is understood and often scoffed at, simply because we have confused servanthood with servitude. Servitude conveys the idea of bondage and even slavery. Servanthood, on the other hand, connotes voluntary service, joyful giving of ourselves, a willing choice to help others, and selfless commitment.

One who is involved in servitude serves unwillingly out of a sense of fear and has no hope of entering into a different state, while one involved in servanthood lives in an exalted state, a healthy and uplifting climate of helping others. Even though challenges must be overcome and problems may abound, the joy of servanthood is the overriding experience.

How do we get from a state of servitude to a state of servanthood? This transition is made when we properly understand the Word of God which clearly defines servanthood by explaining Christ’s purpose in coming to Earth: “. . . *the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many*” (Matthew 20:28). Jesus has lived the perfect life of the servant in our places, so we no longer are constrained to try to “measure up” to what God expects. The Law never saves, never enables us, only shows us our shortcomings.

When we look at Christ, though, and how He lived His earthly life and what He has done for us, we are freed to respond with heartfelt, sincere, loving service to those He has placed around us. The acts of service we render are the same; the motivation and attitude are what make the difference. Through Christ, we are elevated to the exalted state of servanthood.

Prayer:

Dear Heavenly Father, help me to be like You. Empower me to serve others—and therefore serve You—joyfully, lovingly and faithfully. In Your precious name I pray. Amen.

Disability Awareness Sunday was celebrated at St. John's on September 29, 2024. We hope that you were present to participate in this first annual event! Our congregation joined with the rest of the 177 congregations in the California-Nevada-Hawaii District of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod to focus on our calling to serve our Lord through Disability Ministry in our various communities.



We were made aware of the vast numbers of people whose lives are affected by disabilities, either by their own disability or by serving as a care-giver for someone who has a disability. We were amazed to learn that about 85% of these people do not have any connection with a Christian congregation. There are various reasons for this high percentage. At St. John's in Napa, we are committed to be a welcoming congregation for all people, because we know that Jesus has welcomed each one of us with His love! St. John's Disability Ministry Task Force is focused on encouraging congregation members to actively reach out and include people with disabilities and their families in the life of the Church. People with disabilities might benefit from the use of certain adaptations or personal assistance when attending worship service or fellowship activities. They also enjoy being able to serve and contribute their skills and talents in their worship of the Lord and in the activities of the congregation.

On Monday, October 28, volunteers from St. John's Lutheran Church will be serving a fellowship dinner for the Developmentally Disabled Christian Ministry group. This fellowship group, supported by various Christian churches in the Napa community, has been meeting monthly for over 50 years! Our St. John's volunteers served the group last October, and we had a wonderful evening with these dear friends! The gathering is held at the Napa Foursquare Church, 1906 Wise Drive. On October 28, we will meet there at 5 PM to get the meal ready. If you know of anyone with developmental disabilities, please invite them to attend the gathering! The friends usually arrive around 5:30 PM. The evening activities end about 7:00 PM.
